

Weekly Update on July 9, 2010

Work for the coming week:

- Crews will finish laying the temporary asphalt on the west side of the road and do temporary striping then will switch traffic to the temporary asphalt to begin work on the east side. Parkway Blvd. will be closed beginning on Tuesday, July 13.
- The pipe and storm drain work near Lakeview Terrace will continue for the next couple of days - this work is in the middle of the road and requires one-way traffic only with a flagger.
- Crews will be working this Saturday, July 10.
- Tuesday, July 13, crews will begin working on the installation of the storm drain just south of Parkway Blvd., near the staging area of all the construction equipment. The work will move south.
- The trail on Redwood Road adjacent to the Saratoga Springs development will be closed beginning Monday, July 12 from the north end of the development to Lakeview Terrace. The existing trail will be removed and a new trail will be built on the remaining HOA property a little to the east.

Other work to be aware of:

- Utility work is being done on the west side of the road which includes relocating a gas line, power lines, and telephone poles
- Monday, July 19 – crews will begin milling the asphalt in the area between Grandview and Pelican Point. Soft spot repair will also be done where needed. Work will begin on the north end and move south. During this work there will be only one lane open with a flagger.
- A concrete barrier will be placed in the reconstruction area for driver safety during construction. This will take place after the traffic is switched to the temporary asphalt.
- The Saratoga Springs HOA will be closing their access roads onto Redwood Road at various times during construction. This is something the HOA has opted to do on their own since they own the roads in the development.
- A wall will be placed next to the trail and its height will vary depending on the location. The wall will begin at the north end of the development and will end approximately 500 feet north of Grandview Blvd. The wall is part of the mitigation agreed to by the adjacent residents and HOA in lieu of a 6-foot noise wall being placed directly on the Right of Way line. Additional landscaping will be added by the HOA behind the wall at a later date.
